



Change Effective January 2024

On October 23, 2023, the City of Huntington Beach voted to change the default energy plan for Orange County Power Authority (OCPA) Huntington Beach customers from the 100% Renewable Choice Plan to the Basic Choice Plan, effective January 2024. This new default plan costs 2% less than Southern California Edison's (SCE) equivalent generation rates, and continues to support environmental sustainability by providing at least 38.5% renewable energy.

- Customers enrolled in the 100% Renewable Choice Plan will be seamlessly transitioned to the Basic Choice Plan on their regular meter read date in January 2024, with no service interruption.
- Customers currently on Basic Choice or Smart Choice plans will experience no change to their current rate or service.
- Throughout this transition, regardless of any changes to your energy plan, you will remain on your current rate schedule, subject to the rates and terms of OCPA.

Change Effective June 2024

Additionally, your Community Choice Aggregation Service (CCA service) with OCPA will be ending in June 2024. SCE will once again be the provider of both the electric generation and distribution service for your account.

On April 1, 2022, for commercial customers and October 3, 2022, for residential customers, OCPA became the default electricity supply provider for eligible customers located in the City of Huntington Beach. In May 2023, the Huntington Beach City Council voted to leave OCPA. By June 30, 2024, all Huntington Beach customers within the city will be switched to SCE bundled service. You do not have to take any action to be returned to SCE. The transfer of your account to SCE bundled service will occur automatically in June 2024 on your regular meter read date with no disruption to electric service.

- Prior to the transition, you will remain on your current rate schedule, subject to the rates and terms of OCPA.
- You should continue to pay your bills as you normally would. Your bill has always been and will continue to be processed by SCE.

OCPA, the City of Huntington Beach, and SCE are working closely to ensure a smooth transition for OCPA Huntington Beach customers to SCE bundled service.
